

Research Grant Application

Conditions Governing NZWCS Grant

Areas of Research

The New Zealand Wound Care Society (NZWCS) supports research into any area that is related to wounds, wound healing or wound management (including prevention).

Grants available in 2021

The NZWCS will award one or more grants up to a maximum budget of \$5,000.00 (inc GST). The number and value of the awards that are made will depend on the quality of the applications that are received. These grants are likely to be used as seeding funds, which will enable researchers to gain preliminary information that can be used to prepare applications for large-scale grants from different funding bodies.

Tenure

The tenure of the research grant(s) is for one year from release of funds. Funds not used at the completion of that time are to be returned to the NZWCS.

Release of funds

Funds will be released to the appropriate administering Institution once a copy of the approval from the appropriate Ethics Committee has been received by the NZWCS.

Publication of successful application

The NZWCS may publish and release details of the successful application(s) to the media, general public and research community in future publications.

Reports

The successful applicants are required to provide an interim report on the research 6 months after commencing their project, and a final report on completion of the research study.

Submission of Applications

Applications must be received by NZWCS by the advertised closing date, which is **30th November**.

Assessment of applications

The grants will be assessed by a Scientific Advisory Committee appointed by the NZWCS. The successful applicant(s) will be notified in writing and announced in the NZWCS Tissue Issue newsletter and on the NZWCS website.
